The sin of Miriam and Aaron

Some in the message claim the five-fold ministry will finish the mysteries they assert Brother Branham left undone. Some claim the five-fold ministry has the authority to change, alter, or substitute the teachings which Brother Branham expressly taught.

There was a distinction between Moses and any one else with a call of God in their lives. The same is with William Branham.

Aaron was the High Priest, Miriam was a prophetess, yet they were reprimanded for not respecting the man Who God spoke lip to ear with.

There are many Aarons and Miriams today who lack respect for the significance of one chosen man, who like Moses, God spoke lip to ear with. Even more so, this man cleansed not by the blood of sheep and goats, but by the Blood of God, was a chosen vessel that Elohim veiled Himself in, and spoke His Word to the people through.

There was a reason this man was required to keep himself from defiling his body.

There was a reason this man was given the promise of Joshua chapter 1.

No man could withstand him.

No man was equivalent to him.

No man was above him.

God had once again stretched His tent down to mankind. God met him in the little secret closet of his heart. God not only met him at the Door of his tent, He sat with him a while, He communed with him. He spoke to him face to face, as a man speaketh unto his friend. The true five-fold will be as Joshua was to Moses, in perfect submission, abiding in the Word. And if God has need of them, they are there at their post of duty, ready.

Moses typed Christ, he did not type the five-fold ministry.

Understanding this is one of the greatest keys to understanding the fulfillment of Mal 4, Luke 17, and Rev 10. The third pull was a repeat of the type Moses portrayed. How much greater is "the ministry of Christ Hisself" than that of the five-fold ministry?

Numbers 12:1-16

And Miriam and Aaron spake against Moses because of the Ethiopian woman whom he had married: for he had married an Ethiopian woman.

- [2] And they said, Hath the Lord indeed spoken only by Moses? hath he not spoken also by us? And the Lord heard it.
- [3] (Now the man Moses was very meek, above all the men which were upon the face of the earth.)
- [4] And the Lord spake suddenly unto Moses, and unto Aaron, and unto Miriam, Come out ye three unto the tabernacle of the congregation. And they three came out.
- [5] And the Lord came down in the pillar of the cloud, and stood in the door of the tabernacle, and called Aaron and Miriam: and they both came forth.
- [6] And he said, Hear now my words: If there be a prophet among you, I the Lord will make myself known unto him in a vision, and will speak unto him in a dream.
- [7] My servant Moses is not so, who is faithful in all mine house.

- [8] With him will I speak mouth to mouth, even apparently, and not in dark speeches; and the similitude of the Lord shall he behold: wherefore then were ye not afraid to speak against my servant Moses?
- [9] And the anger of the Lord was kindled against them; and he departed.
- [10] And the cloud departed from off the tabernacle; and, behold, Miriam became leprous, white as snow: and Aaron looked upon Miriam, and, behold, she was leprous.
- [11] And Aaron said unto Moses, Alas, my lord, I beseech thee, lay not the sin upon us, wherein we have done foolishly, and wherein we have sinned.

And when they come in before God, God said, "Don't you fear God?" **Said that to the high priest and to Miriam the prophetess**.
